## For Single/One-Person Household

My monthly income is <b>less than \$1,869</b> and I am at least age 60 or disabled. I have <b>less than \$5,000</b> in liquid assets. You may be eligible for the <b>Food Supplement Program</b> ( <i>formerly food stamps</i> ). Contact Maine Department of Health and Human Services – Fort Kent 1-800-432-7340; Caribou 1-800-432-7366; or Houlton 1-800-432-7338 for an application.
My monthly income is <b>less than or equal to \$1,580</b> and I am 60 years or older. You may be eligible for <b>Maine Commodity Supplemental Food Program</b> . Please call Aroostook Agency on Aging at 207 764-3396 to learn more.
I am 60 or older or I am disabled. I am homebound and I have difficulty preparing a meals. You may be eligible for <u>Meals on Wheels</u> . Please call the Agency to determine eligibility and schedule a delivery.
My monthly income is <b>less than \$2,248</b> and I am at least <b>62 or disabled</b> . I am a Maine resident. I have <b>less than \$50,000</b> in liquid assets. You may be eligible for the <b>Low-Cost Drugs for the Elderly and Disabled Program. (DEL).</b> Your income may be higher if you are spending 40% of your income on prescriptions. Call the Agency for more information.
My monthly income is <b>less than \$3,138</b> and I am enrolled in Medicare. I have <b>less than \$50,000</b> in liquid assets. You may be eligible for the <b>Medicare Savings Program (Buy-In)</b> . <i>Income can be higher if working</i> . Please call the Agency to learn more.
My monthly income is <b>less than \$1,677</b> and I am under 65 and not on Medicare. You may be eligible for <u>MaineCare</u> (under the expansion for adults). Cannot be pregnant, eligible for Medicare Part A or B, or eligible in another coverage group. Contact DHHS for more information

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## For Single/One-Person Household

	My monthly income is <b>less than \$4,253</b> and I spend more than 5% of my income on prescription drugs or 15% on medical expenses. You may be eligible for <u>Maine Rx</u> <u>Plus</u> . Unlike the DEL program, the RX Plus program does not consider one's assets. Call the Agency for more information.
	My monthly income is <b>less than \$1,215</b> and I am 65+ or disabled. I have <b>less than \$2,000</b> in liquid assets. Must be over the age of 65 or have a disabling condition per the criteria of the Social Security Administration You may be eligible for <b>MaineCare for the Aged, Blind and Disabled.</b> Cannot be eligible for Medicare Part A or B, or eligible in another coverage group. Contact DHHS for more information.
	My monthly income is less than \$2,572. You may be eligible for the <u>Home Energy</u> <u>Assistance Program.</u> (HEAP) <i>Out-of-pocket medical expenses can sometimes be</i> subtracted to lower your monthly income. Call Aroostook County Action Program (ACAP) at 1-800-585-3053 or 207-768-3053 for more information.
	Maine Senior FarmShare: (MSFP) provides income-eligible older adults the opportunity to receive share (worth \$50) of local produce at no cost from Maine farmers during the growing season. Must be a Maine resident, 60+ and meet the income guidelines \$26,973 per year for a one-person household. Call the Agency for more details.
*	The Low-Cost Drugs for the Elderly or Disabled and Maine Rx Plus give a discount on prescription drugs only. They do not substitute for insurance coverage.
*	Liquid Assets include cash or other resources that can be converted into cash on

demand.
